
HOLIDAY CHEER

Mireille and her climbing teammates from BFL were cheered on by colleagues and executives at the top of the mountain. Together, the group raised a record \$75,000 in support of pediatric palliative care in BC and the Yukon showing that a connected organization can make a big difference.


